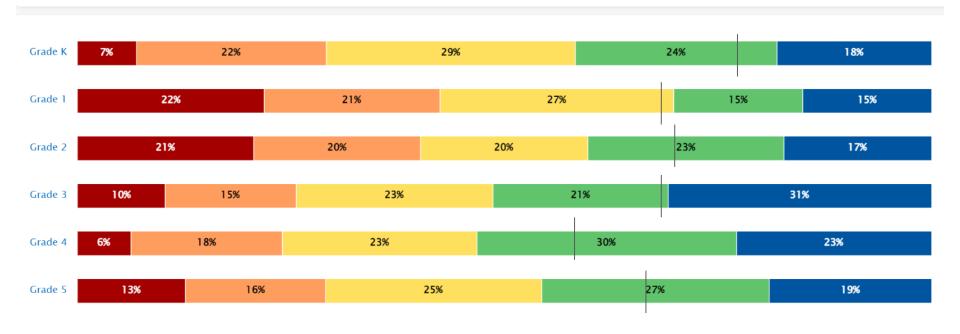

- This satisfies the reporting requirement mandated for ESSER funds (PA 48, section 98b
  - The data does highlight our district goals:

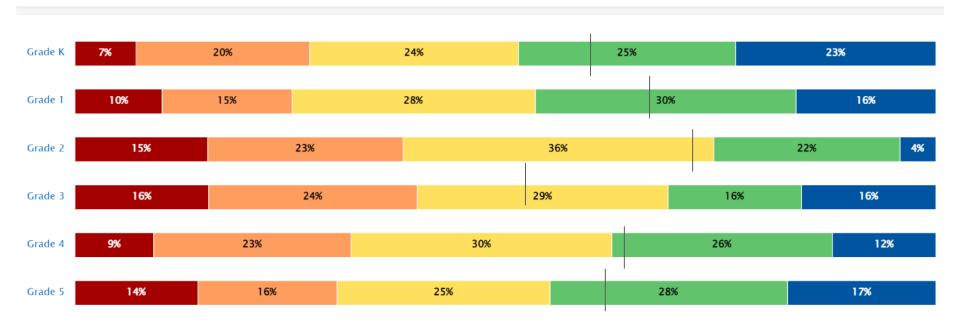

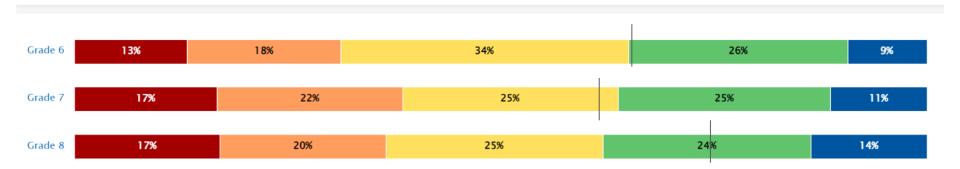

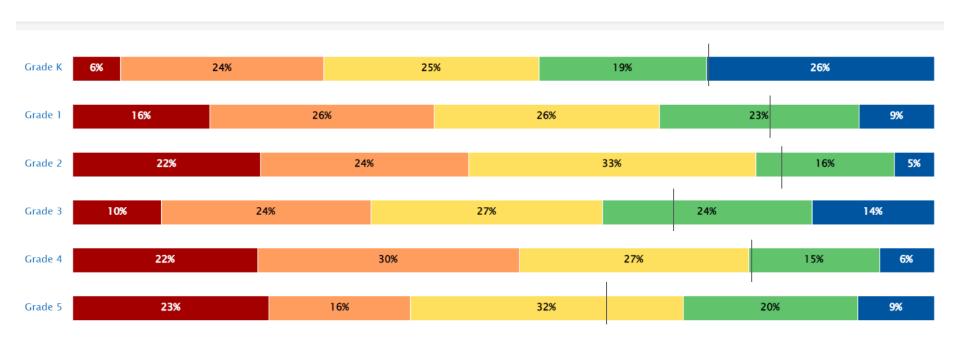

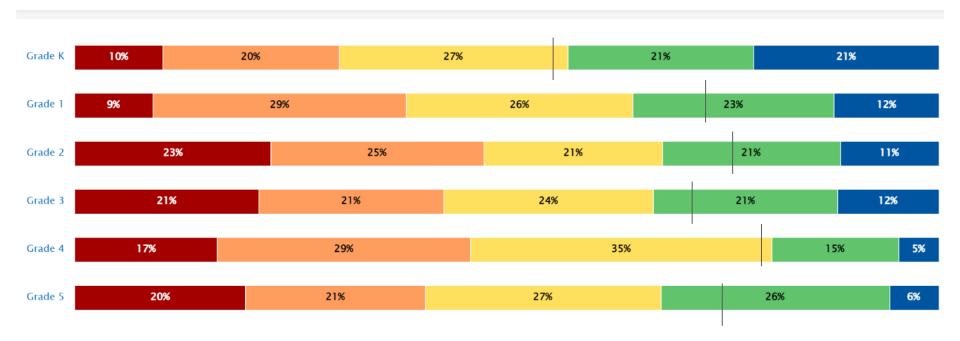

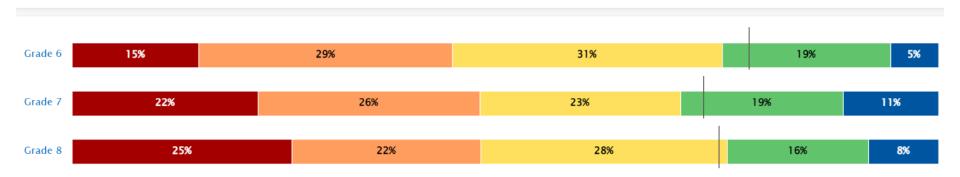

1% fewer D and E from last year at the HS, and when you combine CS and HS, it goes from 1% fewer E to 2% fewer E. That is approximately 200 fewer D or E grades for our kids.

# HS Data, cont

- Our students who attended William D Ford (WDF) did really well. All former CS students passed their WDF course. Of the 62 that attend only 1 student did not pass their WDF course
- 12 former CS students failed one class, 8 failed 2 classes. 23 passed all 6 classes.
  - 5 of those 43 graduated at the semester. There are 38 former community school students left.
  - HS admin has individualized plans for each of the remaining students and are working with those who failed a class an are now "off-track" from their original plan.

#### What Comes Next?

- We will continue our progress monitoring and MTSS meetings (next slide).
- We have made it a district priority to focus on small group instruction, and the results show the commitment to small group instruction is working. Small group is also becoming a focus in math in addition to literacy. At the high school, there is a constant focus on the Success Team to make sure that students who are struggling are on teacher and administrator radars with interventions as necessary.
  - Success team is an "all hands" review of individual students and the Tier I and II interventions
    they are exposed to, their success to date, and a plan moving forward. Includes social
    emotional health as well. Admin, counselors, social workers, SRO, nurse, JRC, teacher
    consultant, learning lab all present.

#### 6-8 MTSS Processes

- Panther Study Hall
  - Students can make up tests, quizzes, and assignments for a grade (partial credit-full credit depending on the time frame)
- Counselors meet with students who are in danger of failing classes in November and December to work to ensure classes are passed.
- Small group instruction has been a key focus this year. In fact, the middle school has already started that process and has had great feedback from both teachers and students!
  - There was a visit to WBSD Middle School with administration and the math department, we are seeting up an ELA visit in the coming weeks.
- Continued review of D & E rate with teachers and admin. Aligned professional development to instructional best practice

#### 9-12 MTSS Interventions

- Academic Support (former CS students and those in targeted core areas)
  - New math class for students who did not experience success in Alg 1A
  - 17 students
  - Kids are double blocked in Alg 1B with Academic Support. They receive support for Alg 1B while getting instruction to fill gaps from Alg 1A
- Individualized conversations with students who one E or more (Sean, Giovanni, and Jason)
  - o Bi-Monthly (every other week, Bi-Weekly?)
- Teachers are allowing students who make up assignments and tests at Jag Study (after school). There are continued conversations about zeros with the staff.
- Continued review of D & E rate with teachers and admin. Aligned professional development to instructional best practice
